



According to Belize tourism officials, the most popular weddings are barefoot weddings on a sandy beach at sunset.

After the wedding, visitors to Belize who love the outdoors have exciting options.

"Whether your intention is to be boldly adventurous by ziplining through the rainforest and scaling an ancient Mayan temple, or to relax placidly by the turquoise clear sea, there is so much to do and marvelous things to see in Belize, that it keeps you wanting more," said Director of Tourism, Karen Bevans.

A new cruise ship port, additional airlift and room stock, as well as several new large scale investments are fuelling tourism growth in Belize. An increase in airlift will boost tourism arrivals for the upcoming winter season.

WestJet began operating a nonstop flight between Belize and Toronto in October.

"A direct flight has been highly requested by visitors and industry stakeholders. It will make travelling to Belize so much easier and more convenient as this will eliminate connection or layover time. This direct flight is absolutely going to

boost our arrival numbers further, especially where the Canadian market is concerned," the Director of Tourism said.

Flights from the U.S. market are also increasing. Southwest Airlines will begin operating a seasonal flight between Belize and Denver, Colorado in March, 2017. Tropic Air also has an additional flight twice a week - Tuesday and Saturday - from Cancun, Mexico.

Norwegian Cruise Line's Harvest Caye port is scheduled to officially open in mid-November, 2016. The cruise line will have four calls per week.

Belize currently has a total of 8,257 rooms. The current room stock is expected to increase by roughly 600 more rooms between the remainder of 2016 and in 2017.

Mahogany Bay Village, a luxury accommodation set to open in early 2017, will be the first Hilton Worldwide property in Belize, under the Curio collection.

Lighthouse Reef, Blackadore Caye, Caye Chapel and Placencia are some of the new large-scale tourism investments, while several properties are expanding. The new projects are expected to generate employment for 18,000 people.

Last year, 341,125 overnight visitors went to Belize. Arrivals for 2016 are expected to increase by just over 11 percent.

Ambergris Caye, Belize's largest island known for its Caribbean beaches, water sports and scuba diving, was named as Mexico and Central America's Leading Destination in the Caribbean at the 2015 World Travel Awards.
